- County Programs and Policies Affecting Women
- Legislative Issues to Promote Women's Equal Rights

History

A *Status of Women Task Force* was formed in May 1973 at the County level. The Board of Supervisors approved an *Ad Hoc Committee on the Status of Women* on June 25, 1974. On September 4, 1975 the County of San Diego Board of Supervisors established the *San Diego County Commission on the Status of Women*, **Article IV, Section 85, San Diego County Code of Administrative Ordinances**.
